Debit and Credit Card Skimming

Card skimming is one way thieves try to steal debit or credit card information.

A card skimmer is a small device discreetly attached to payment terminals, so that when cards are inserted or swiped for a transaction, the device captures or skims the card information. Thieves then use the skimmed information to clone cards, access accounts, and make fraudulent purchases.

How to help protect yourself:

AT ATMS

- Use busy ATMs. When possible, pick an ATM inside a bank lobby or in a brightly lit, high-traffic area.
 Check for tampering. Look for broken, dented, or scratched panels, a compromised security seal, loose parts or pieces, or sticky tape residue.
 Look for irregularities and inconsistencies. Compare the
- keypad or card reader to the rest of the machine to see if colors, styles, or graphics are mismatched, misaligned, or obscured.
- ☐ Cover the keypad. When entering your PIN, shield the keypad so hidden cameras can't capture it.
- ☐ Secure your card and cash. After completing your transaction and before leaving the ATM area, secure both your card and money.
- ☐ **Be vigilant.** Stay aware of your surroundings and, of course, keep distance between you and other ATM users.

AT POINT-OF-SALE TERMINALS

- ☐ Shop wisely. Visit merchants that you know and trust or, at the very least, go to stores where the point-of-sale terminal is located next to the clerk.
- ☐ Spot-check the machine. Before inserting or swiping your card, look for anything odd, damaged or loose. And, if it's difficult to insert your card, don't use the terminal.
- ☐ Know where your card is at all times. Keep an eye on your card and make sure it's given back to you.
- ☐ Total the charge before signing. Never sign a charge without writing in the total and drawing lines across blank lines and unused spaces.
